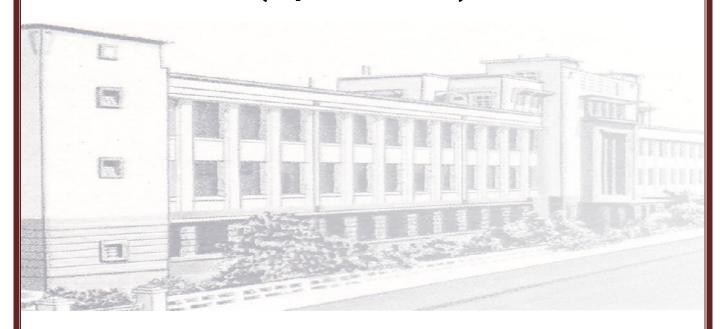

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Exam conducted on behalf of Mumbai University. College conducts First Year and Second Year Exams. Third Year and M.Com. Exams are conducted by University of Mumbai.

- 1. Examination of F.Y.B.Com, & S.Y.B.Com, was divided in to first term Syllabus for 50 Marks & Second term Syllabus for 50 Marks.
- 2. Subject like foundation course has a project of 20 Marks.
- 3. Business communication, Mathematical & Statistical techniques have tutorials of 10 Marks each.
- 4. ATKT Exam. Conducted of 100 Marks for failure student in October & March every year.
- 5. T.Y.B.Com & M. Com I & II Exam. are of 100 Marks each conducted in March/April every year.
- 6. Examination of BBI and B.MS, was divided in two semesters of 100 Marks (60 Marks for Theory + 40 Marks for Internal).
- 7. Masking of answer sheets is done and code numbers are given. Moderation and Revaluation is done, Photocopy of assessed answer sheet is given to students who asks for its revaluation if desired.
- 8. Moderation of answer papers is done by outside faculty. Coding method was adopted & enhanced to ensure confidentiality of exam papers & strictly adhered to.

6.3.4 Research and Development

Research committee invited subject experts to guide the interested faculty, members for the research activity /research projects.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

ICT - Class room Mike & speaker system in self financed section.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

On job training provided to the students during vacations in order to expose them to the requirements of the practical world.

Teaching staff is regularly sent for refresher courses and the Non Teaching staff is sent for training programme organised by the Joint Director of Higher Education Mumbai Region.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

- 1. The recruitment of the permanent faculty is done by Maharashtra Public Service Commission.
- 2. The temporary, on contract basis appointment of teaching, non-teaching staff was on the institutional level only for the specific period.
- 3. Sydenham being a Government college, the faculty members are transferred to other college & vice versa. New faculty members join the college in the beginning of the academic year / term.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

Campus selection scheme organised by college in collaboration with various companies & few students were selected with good pay packages.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

On the basis of merit list, students were admitted to the respective course of their choice. However, as per circular no. Dha.Ma.188/2003 dated 13th march 2003, in-house students will be admitted first. The remaining seats will be filled on the basis of the merit list. As per the instructions of University of Mumbai, keeping the reserved category intact as per the govt rules.
